## 2025 Annual Meeting

July 10-12, 2025 | The Breakers Palm Beach

The Breakers was founded on the sands of Palm Beach in 1896. In the late 1890s, just before the turn of the century, industry tycoons and elegant socialites began flocking to the pristine shores of a new destination—a long strip of an island called Palm Beach.

Founder Henry M. Flagler, one of America's great industrialists, started the trend of grand, gorgeous properties on the island. His first was The Royal Poinciana, a six-story Georgian beauty. Two years later, Flagler debuted his premier oceanfront hotel, which delighted guests with its proximity to the water and unique location—right at “the breakers,” where the waves crashed and sprayed.



After fires in both 1903 and 1925, the hotel reemerged more opulent each time. The Breakers reopened in 1926, ushering in a higher degree of European influence and architectural flair. Flagler's newest iteration was modeled after the magnificent Villa Medici in Rome—an ambitious effort that called for 75 artisans brought in from Italy. Together they completed the intricate paintings, detailed across the ceilings of the 200-foot-long main lobby and first-floor public rooms, which remain on display today.

Year by year, the resort's reputation grew and word spread, beckoning the glitterati to vacation in Palm Beach year-round. At any given time, the guest register read like a “who's who” of early 20th-century America: Rockefellers, Vanderbilts, Astors, Andrew Carnegie and J.P. Morgan, vacationing alongside US presidents and European nobility.

Today, the story of The Breakers continues, holding fast to the ideals that put it on the map—unapologetic luxury, seaside glamour and world-class service—but also embracing the new. **Become a part of the new, save the meeting date and reserve your room today.**

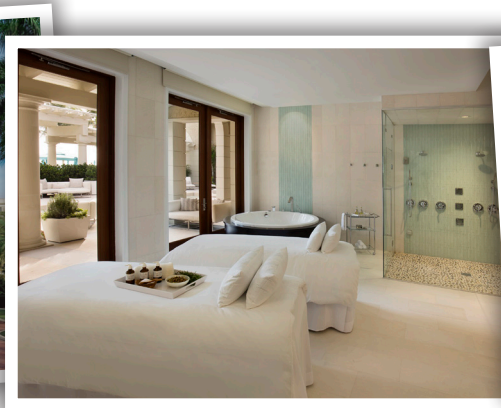

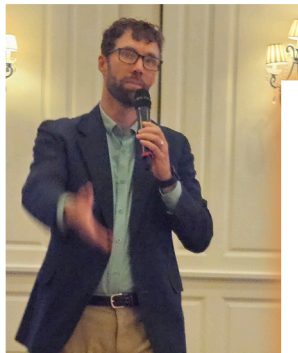
# 2025 Annual Meeting *continued from the cover*

## Bioceramics: How Far Have We Come?

Root canal obturation involves sealing the space created after biomechanical instrumentation and disinfection with gutta percha and a sealer. However, the introduction of tricalcium silicate cements have changed the philosophy of the seal to a sealer based obturation, instead of a gutta-percha predominant one. The presentation is an overview of evidence-based evaluation of the chemical, physical and biological properties of Bioceramics pertinent to endodontics primarily as a sealer. Published research will be critically reviewed and clinical cases presented demonstrating the technique and its modification. Clinical cases presented demonstrating the applications in various other treatment modalities, such as vital pulp therapy, endodontic microsurgery, reimplantation, revascularization etc., will also be presented.

By the end of the presentation the participants will:

1. Have an evidence-based evaluation of the chemical, physical and biological properties of Bioceramics pertinent to endodontics.
2. Be able to evaluate the advantages and limitations in clinical use.

## Dental Traumatic Injuries: Striving for the Best Outcome

The incidence of dental trauma is highest in the first two decades of life and hence, the young permanent anterior teeth are of particular importance in traumatic injuries. Successful retention of these teeth is paramount to long-term esthetic, function and health of not just the oral cavity but also the physiological impact the loss may have on these young patients. This presentation reviews the latest guidelines by IADT and AAE, to understand how and why, they have changed over time. Treatment options and prognosis for each type of injury based on the biological goals is reviewed, and current literature discussed.

By the end of the presentation the participants will:

1. Learn to review the biological sequelae of dental traumatic injuries
2. Evaluate treatment aims based on current guidelines to maximize positive outcome
3. Recognize possible future treatment trends in dental trauma

## External Root Resorption: Retaining the Tooth

Resorption is a challenging pathological condition to manage. Whether the resorptive defect is a result of traumatic injury or idiopathic, decisions to treat or not to treat, how to treat are not always straightforward but may require multidisciplinary approach. This presentation is an overview of pathogenesis of the resorptive process. With the understanding we will explore various clinical solutions. The current guidelines provided by ESE for resorption will be discussed along with clinical case and management options.

# What is the SESG Foundation about?

## Overview/Guidelines

The purpose of the Southern Endodontic Study Group Foundation (SESG) is to provide financial assistance to endodontic residents and early career (up to 3 years post residency) endodontists so they may attend an SESG meeting. This will help to ensure the sustainability of the organization as these residents/endodontists will hopefully join the group and attend future meetings.

The foundation will cover the meeting registration fee and cost of lodging for the meeting days at the base room rate, including taxes, resort fee if applicable, and self-parking. Any registration costs for guests or children the recipient chooses to bring will be the responsibility of the recipient. Travel to and from the meeting will be the responsibility of the recipient.

To be eligible, the recipient must be attending an endodontic residency, located in the SESG region or have graduated from an endodontic residency no more than three years prior and be practicing in the SESG region. The recipient must be a member in good standing in the AAE. The recipient must complete an application to the SESG Executive Council three months prior to the meeting start date. From the pool of applicants, the executive council will review the applications and select the number of recipients based on available funds for that year two months prior to the meeting. This will allow time for recipient(s) to make travel plans and hotel reservations.

Applicants will submit a CV, a letter of recommendation, and a short (no more than 300 words) essay describing their interest in attending SESG. The executive council will solicit applications by sending request letters to all endodontic program directors within the SESG region and to AAE members practicing no more than three years who live in the SESG region.

The funds raised for the foundation will be housed by the Florida Dental Association Foundation and will be placed in an investment fund to increase the amount of available funds to support the awards. The SESG Executive Council and Executive Director will oversee the operations of the foundation, to include, fundraising activities, application review, and distribution of funds.
